SHARING THE GOOD NEWS

On February 4, during our all church gathering, many of you heard your leadership share our vision for Mayfield UMC. Over the past six months, the Executive Committee has worked with the Unstuck Group to focus on our mission, vision, and several strategic goals. Out of this work was birthed our vision, which is to:

Take our faith into the world, and focus beyond our walls to engage de-churched and non-Christians by invitations to get involved, so that they will know Jesus is for them and commit their life to Christ.

This vision will continue to be our guiding path to make decisions and to offer Christ to others.

During our meeting, I shared that we gather as a whole community of faith because collectively, we have gotten to know Jesus. We have fallen in love with the one who is our Creator, who loves us and made us for good purposes in this world. We have experienced our Redeemer who brings us back from the brink of pain and destruction. We have seen our need for our Sustainer through the normal everyday moments of life, and through the deepest depths and the highest mountaintop joys. And, we recognize the need for people to experience this power of Christ in their lives!

It is why our vision for Mayfield United Methodist Church is to be a place where our focus is beyond ourselves.

To focus in the world and to those who have walked away from church or never known the love of Christ. We are called to the greatest joy of sharing the Good News with others and to offer invitations to meet Jesus in their lives and experience the transforming grace and love that we have experienced.

How do we do this? Through building relationships, and getting to know people's stories.

I want to offer some individual challenges for each of you. I want to challenge you to come early and stay late on a Sunday morning. Where are you able to use your spiritual and other gifts to serve? When you look around on a Sunday morning, do you see faces you do not recognize? Say 'hello' and introduce yourself by name. Ask a few questions such as "Where do you live?," "How has your week been?," "Can I answer any questions for you?," "Can I help you get connected here at Mayfield Church?"

Each one of us can offer warm invitations and graceful hospitality. We are called to be an active, serving, part of the community of Christ at Mayfield UMC. We can live as a community of faith that Paul described in Ephesians 4: 1-6 (NIV):

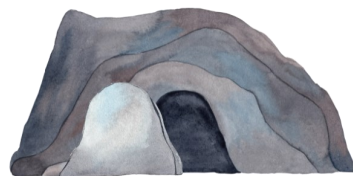

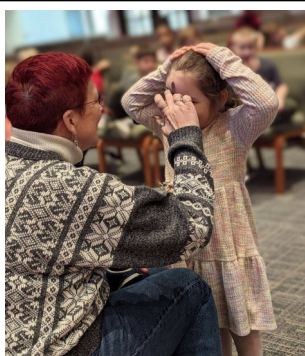

Shortly after moving to Cleveland, he joined the staff of Hope Ridge United Methodist Church and served as the Worship Director for almost ten years. He met his beautiful wife Sarah at Hope Ridge UMC, and together they have a three-year-old named Olivia and are expecting a son in April. Outside of work, Jonathan and Sarah are heavily involved in the local community theater scene, and Jonathan can often be found music directing a production and/or playing in a production's orchestra. He is also the President of the Board of Directors for Rabbit Run Community Arts Association and an adjudicator for Playhouse Square's Dazzle Awards. He loves the opportunity to speak to congregations and has done so throughout Ohio, fundamentally with the message of "serving others as if you are the only 'Jesus' they will ever meet."

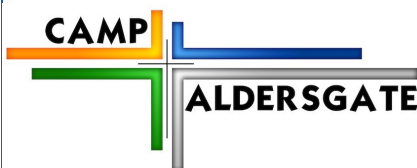

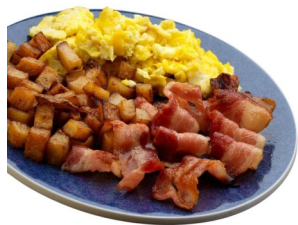

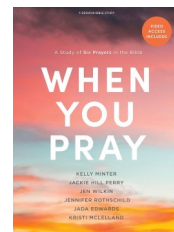
