OUR FAITH IN CHRIST

As evening came, Jesus said to his disciples, "Let's cross to the other side of the lake." So they took Jesus in the boat and started out, leaving the crowds behind (although other boats followed). But soon a fierce storm came up. High waves were breaking into the boat, and it began to fill with water. Jesus was sleeping at the back of the boat with his head on a cushion. The disciples woke him up, shouting, "Teacher, don't you care that we're going to drown?" When Jesus woke up, he rebuked the



wind and said to the waves, "Silence! Be still!" Suddenly the wind stopped, and there was a great calm. Then he asked them, "Why are you afraid? Do you still have no faith?" The disciples were absolutely terrified. "Who is this man?" they asked each other. "Even the wind and waves obey him!"

Mark 4:35-41 (NLT)

This vignette of Jesus and his disciples has stuck in my head. Up to this point in the book of Mark, Jesus was baptized by John and had been teaching the crowds. Jesus had been miraculously healing people, and now here he is controlling nature. And Jesus asked them, "Why are you afraid? Do you still have no faith?"

I know that we have had a lot of changes in the life of the church, and some of you may feel like the disciples did at this moment. Tossed about and uncertain. But, when I hear Jesus' questions to the disciples, it reminds me of our faith in Christ.

I'm aware that change brings a fear of the unknown, but as followers of Christ, the center of our lives is love, not fear. The writer of First John reminds us that "There is no fear in love. But perfect love drives out fear..." (1 John 4:18 NIV)

We are called to offer Christ, which is centered in the love Christ gave us in this world. The changes also bring opportunities for us to discover something new about ourselves and to grow more deeply rooted in our faith in Christ, whom we claim as the Savior and Redeemer of our lives of faith.

So let me fill you in on some details to move from uncertainty and also offer some invitations for you to participate in our mission at Mayfield Church. Here are some of the questions that I've been asked:

Question: What will Pastor Jill's responsibilities be?

As our Associate Pastor, Pastor Jill will be responsible for many of the ministries Pastor Jan has been overseeing. She will oversee pastoral care and the home visitation team. She will also work with Adult discipleship, including LifeGroups and small groups. And, she will work with the Mission Outreach Council on our mission opportunities. Pastor Jill has had a busy start, as she has connected with several small groups this month to introduce herself and has begun to do pastoral visits and calls to the congregation. See her article about the plans for Adult Discipleship for this fall.

Question: What will we be doing for youth as we move toward the fall?

SPRC has posted a part-time (10-15 hours/week) youth position to lead Sunday School in the morning and youth fellowship on Sunday evenings. We believe that this position, partnered with faithful servant volunteers, can engage our youth in their faith journey. I will work with this person and the volunteers directly.

We believe that we have an excellent youth program. Adult mentors and parents have a huge ability to be a positive influence on youths' faith and to help them be shaped by the way that we live our faith. As we move into the fall, we will continue to encourage our young people and hope to live our faith alongside them. For the fall, Adam Neff, Chelsea Stickley, Drew Sulzer, Kristy Nelson, Pastor Jill, and Pastor Beth plan to work together to make our program fun, engaging, and most importantly, help our youth grow in their walk with Christ.

Pastor Jill and I will take on the responsibility of the Confirmation program beginning this fall, where we again believe that the gift of our multi-generational congregation can build deep relationships with our youth as they develop in their faith. We will plan to have an informational meeting on Sunday, August 27.

Question: Will we continue to work with South Euclid Lyndhurst Schools?

Yes! We will continue our relationship with Rowland School. Before the end of the school year, I met with Shannon, who is the social worker at the SEL Schools, about our partnership with Rowland Elementary School. She, as well as Principal Lee and Assistant Principal Sylvia, have expressed the wonderful impact that this connection has made on their staff, students, and school community. Not every school district will let a faith community adopt and partner with them like SEL schools. It is a joy to make a difference in the world in this way. In August, SEL schools will be our "Hands that Serve." Check out the article on the next page, and on Sunday, August 20, will be our *Holy Donut Day*, with the proceeds supporting this ministry throughout the year. It's Back-to-School Time! The first day for students at our partner elementary school, Rowland, is Aug. 25. Our schools ministry is this month's "Hands That Serve" mission focus. Here's what we'll be doing for our students and staff:

• School Supplies: We are asking each Mayfield family to buy one of the following — crayons, markers, two-pocket paper folders, No. 2 pencils, glue or ear buds (see list below) and place in the gray bins at the three entrances during the month of August.

This year, Ohio will have a sales tax holiday from Fri., Aug. 4, 2023, at 12 AM to Sun., Aug. 6, at 11:59 PM. During the holiday, the following items are exempt from sales and use tax: An item of clothing priced at \$75 or less. An item of school supplies priced at \$20 or less.

• Holy Donut Day: Our fundraiser for students is back! On Aug. 20, we'll enjoy delicious Patterson's donuts in Fellowship Hall where all proceeds will benefit our partner schools. In the past, more than 56,000 new books put into the hands of students! Sylvia Marshall, Assistant Principle of Rowland School, will attend this fun filled morning.



In the next few weeks, we will be putting together a plan to address these areas of interest. We also feel that there is currently a need for a grief sharing group.

Although Rev. Beth and I will be facilitating some of these groups, it would be great if anyone feels a call to help lead a group or two. If you are interested, please let us know and we will gladly talk with you about it.

Stay tuned for the launch of these new groups in late August or early September. We can't wait for you to be involved!


