Offering Christ Prayer Guide: Day 17

Meditation: Baptism is our sacrament as Christians, to mark that we are a part of the body of Christ, that we are forgiven, and are given new life. In this moment we die to ourselves and are raised in the Spirit of Christ. This means that our will and lives are turned over to God.

Scripture: Therefore, since we are receiving a kingdom that cannot be shaken, let us be thankful, and so worship God acceptably with reverence and awe, for our 'God is a consuming fire.'

- Hebrews 12:28-29 (NIV)

Pray: Offer a prayer today to turn your life over once again to God, and that you would allow your heart to overflow with Christ's humility, love, grace, and service.

This past month, I've been intentional about taking time to be quiet and still. However, I can tell you that I find it extremely hard to be guiet and be still. But when I do, lyrics of songs come to me and words of Scripture are spoken in the quiet. Phil Wickham's lyrics from House of the Lord keep returning to me:

LENTEN STUDY BEGINS THIS MONTH!

The season of Lent is a few weeks away, and this year our church will be studying the book "John: The Gospel of Light and Life," by Rev.

Adam Hamilton, Hamilton, a United Methodist pastor in Leawood, Kansas, writes in his introduction:

"John is unique among the Gospels ... many of the events recorded in John are not found in the Synoptic Gospels [Matthew, Mark, and Luke].

"John's Gospel is largely set in and around Jerusalem, whereas the Synoptic Gospels record Jesus' ministry in the Galilee.

"Jesus sounds different in the Synoptic Gospels, where he speaks in parables and in a straightforward, plainspoken way. But in John, Jesus speaks in metaphors that are more obscure."

Should be a great study!

Our first message will be on Sunday, Feb. 26. You may buy your book (\$5) in the Bookstore after service on any Sunday in February. If you would like a book, but are not able to be in church, please email Pastor Jan at jan@mayfieldchurch.org, or call the office, and she will make sure you receive one. You also can find the book at the library, or it is available digitally if you search in the Hoopla app for Clevenet users.

Many of our LifeGroups will take part in this study. A full list will be released later this month, along with a daily devotional (similar to last year's Lenten devotional about the Gospel of Luke).

HANDS THAT SERVE: EMSIZINI




Mayfield Church has been in partnership with Bethel Church, Bulawayo, Zimbabwe, since 2014 in supporting the Emsizini secondary school, located in Kensington Zimbabwe. In this partnership, Mayfield Church has supported many capital improvements including upgraded bathrooms, a science classroom building, a home for the school caretaker and his family, and the conversion of the teacher's cottage into a student boarding house. School programming has been supported with the purchase of administrator's computers, student desks and chairs, sewing machines, science classroom equipment, whiteboards, sports equipment, choir robes, and various teaching supplies. We have also supported the school with our presence, with five adults and nine college students visiting the school on six separate trips.

Most recently, Mayfield Church has supported the school with a solar system with panels, inverter, and batteries to power the water well and provide lighting in the boarding house. Other funds given in 2022 helped to provide for student examination materials and fees, school vehicle maintenance, firewood and food staples for the boarding students.

Some of the items we are focusing on in 2023 are painting and repairs in the classrooms, chaplain's house, and lavatory buildings. Also, floor tiling in the science laboratory and installation of security bars for the boarding house. Additionally, we would like to support the school with funds for personal protective equipment. Cost estimates for these projects is \$8,000.

Another opportunity for home groups and individuals is the Emsizini Teacher Partner Program. This program, which began three years ago, has been a way to show appreciation and love to the teachers and staff at Emsizini. Funds from this program help cover fuel for teacher commuting costs and provide a modest year-end bonus to the teachers and staff for a job well done. The teachers at Emsizini are dedicated to their students. This dedication is shown by working through strikes and working weekends to provide additional instruction to students that prepares them for exams.

Due to 2023 potentially being an election year in Zimbabwe there is not a firm date for our next visit to Emsizini. OUR PARTNER SCHOOL: ROWLAND

This year we will supply spring-break snack bags to nearly 450 students at Rowland Elementary in South Euclid. As some may recall, we had helped with the food bags for several years before COVID stopped the project. Now we're back ... Yay God!
