Love God. Love People.

Mayfield Church is a community of believers, who support families, build people up and are engaged disciples.

This month, our sermon series, is following questions raised in Rev. Adam Hamilton's book, Wrestling with Doubt, Finding Faith.' He discusses some of our most significant sources of doubt and shows how a steady trust in God can emerge from them. Delving into questions like: "Does God exist? How can I know?" | "Is the Bible true?" | "Why do prayers go unanswered?" Hamilton approaches these sources of doubt with honesty and insight, drawing on the rich wisdom of the Bible, Christian tradition, and his experience walking with thousands of people on their spiritual journey. Some of his books are still available on the Welcome Desk.

Our questions of faith are often best discussed in small groups, with trusted fellow companions on our journey of faith, and our life of faith is best fed through a steady devotional life with God involving prayer and reflection on a daily basis.

There are plenty of resources out there, but several that I'd suggest for understanding the Bible are: Struggling with Scripture by Walter Bruggemann, William C. Placher, and Brian K. Blount, Animate: Bible from Sparkhouse Publishing (a great group study), or Making Sense of the Bible by Adam Hamilton (can be a group study).

In the introduction the little book, "Struggling with Scripture" where well known professors of New and Old Testament present short essays about the topic of how we struggle with the Bible. William Sloane Coffin, says:

I suggest at the outset that highly intelligent people often have reservations about the Bible. Without question, honest uncertainty beats hard-nosed certitude. But it is a mistake to be paralyzed by uncertainty, especially when life so frequently calls upon us to act wholeheartedly without absolute certainty. Moreover, wrestling with Scripture, far from a sign of weakness, is a reflection of religious faithfulness. What else should you wrestle with if not the Bible? What struggle offers more reward? The Bible is like a sacrament, a means of grace; it mediates God's presence in the life of each of us and God's concern for the whole planet. Preaching from its pages for over forty years, I have encountered a God who bruises our egos but mends our hearts; a God who pleads without ceasing the cause of the poor and needy, who implores us to revere, not ravish the earth, and to stay on the stony, long, and ofttimes lonely road that leads to world peace.

In our daily devotional practices, several that I've come to enjoy are: Disciplines from the Upper Room, Dwelling Places by By Lucinda Secrest McDowell, and the app Lectio 365.

I know that my wrestling with the tough questions of faith, and questions about the Bible itself, have drawn a deeper connection to Christ as my Lord and Savior. I pray that you'll find that the same is true in your Bible study and devotional life with God.






