How do we continue to grow in the grace and knowledge of our Lord and Savior, Jesus Christ, in the season after Easter?

I asked each staff member to share a book or study they have done in the past year that has helped them grow.

Carol shared: "For my spiritual health, I read the daily devotional "Jesus Calling" by Sarah Young. Also, the hymns nourish my soul."

Jess shared: In our winter Mom's Group book study, we read the book "Habits of the Household," by Justin While Earley which gave us great tips to keep God at the center of our everyday moments. My favorite tip that I have implemented is to first spend time with God instead of reading emails, texts, and your to-do list the moment you wake up. Now, when I first grab my phone, I'm seeking the Word of God above all else, and it's been a wonderful way to start my day!

Pastor Diane shared: I am reading Rosamund Stone Zander and Ben Zander's book, "The Art of Possibility: Transforming Professional and Personal Life." Though it is a 'secular' book, I reread it every couple of years. I find that God uses it to help me remember how I want to think and how I want to respond to people. A valuable and fun read!

Pastor Beth: Last year, I read a lot of books about grief and suffering. One surprising book was "Where is God When it Hurts?" by Philip Yancey, which discusses the problem of mostly physical pain. One of our deep questions of faith is when bad things happen or when people suffer. This book offered some beautiful insight. It reminded me of 2 Corinthians 1:3-4 (CEB) "May the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ be blessed! He is the compassionate Father and God of all comfort. He's the one who comforts us in all our trouble so that we can comfort other people who are in every kind of trouble. We offer the same comfort that we ourselves received from God."







As we have looked at spaces around the church building where both children & adults worship, we have used Cora's memorial funds in different areas. In The Rock we have upgraded our tweens small group space to bright couches & comfortable chairs for engaging lessons.

We also purchased collaboration tables & chairs to be used as an art space, conversation for the 1-3rd grade small group time & games. We plan to add storage space in this room as well & a reading nook by the end of the year.

On the main level, sensory stations for all ages have been added outside of the worship center. These storage organizers contain ear plugs, labyrinth mazes, fidgets, large print hymnals, drawing pads, wobble cushions & coloring pages to be used during worship & other events taking place in the Worship Center.
