Dear Mayfield UMC Family,

Over the last year, our Executive Committee has undertaken significant work to align our infrastructure and unify our operations at Mayfield UMC. A part of this work over the last six months has involved reintegrating Heartland Childcare Center (HCC) into our organizational structure of committees and operational umbrella.

Inwardly, our hope is that this will bring greater cohesion to Heartland being a ministry of Mayfield UMC, provide clarity about organizational priorities and collaboration, and unify our team of staff and teachers at Heartland CC with our broader organization.

Last year, our Heartland Childcare Director, Patty Wenzel, led the expansion of HCC and enabled the opening of classrooms for infants and toddlers. There was a lot of dust behind the scenes as our Trustee Committee and our facility manager, Steve Vegel, worked on several updates to the space.

This year, our administrative teams- SPRC, Finance, and Executive Committee, as well as Darlene, our financial administrator, have been working hard. Our Heartland Board will now be called the Heartland Committee & consist only of members of the church, and oversee the administrative work such as salaries, budgets, and physical building needs for HCC in collaboration with our administrative teams for the church. HCC will also continue to have a Family Fun Team- which will continue to plan appreciation events for the teachers and staff, as well as other fun for the families at Heartland. SPRC has also worked tirelessly to make sure our Heartland Childcare Center Staff will have an updated employment policy guidelines & other benefits that match MUMC's staff.

In anticipation of these changes, in June, we shared with the families at Heartland Childcare Center the following information:

Dear Heartland Childcare Center Families,

Beginning June 1, it will be necessary for Heartland Childcare Center to raise our tuition rates.. This change is necessary, and we know that it impacts our families. Our goal is to continue to offer quality education and care for your child, with extracurricular activities at no additional cost, as well as food included made daily. Our rates will continue to stay competitive with other programs in our area.

Over the past few years, we have not raised our rates at the same pace as inflation and our expenses have continued to increase. Beginning this year, we are also going to be offering our full-time employees the benefits of healthcare and a retirement matching. Offering these benefits to our employees will increase their quality of life and do what we believe is the right thing to do for employees. I am sure you would agree with this.

Heartland Childcare Center continues to maintain the highest quality of program, with our Gold star through the State of Ohio. This means that we care deeply about the quality of childcare that each child and family receive through our program. We believe that these changes will allow us to continue to thrive into the future.



2025 UMC East Ohio Annual Conference Report

The UMC's East Ohio Annual Conference typically features fellowship, inspiration, information and participation. We discuss, question, debate and vote on issues large and small. Some years the conference features weighty, significant issues; some years not.

This year marked a milestone as the conference moved to a new location, welcomed a new bishop, and announced plans to unify Ohio's two UMC conferences. After many years at Lakeside Chautauqua near Port Clinton and a brief stay at Akron's John S. Knight Center in 2021, the June 12–14 gathering was held in the peaceful, rural setting of the College of Wooster campus, about 70 miles southwest of Chesterland. Most importantly, the 601 delegates (289 clergy and 312 laity) were welcomed by Bishop Hee-Soo Jung.

Bishop Jung, who was raised in South Korea by Buddhist parents and became a Christian after a chance encounter with a missionary and was baptized at age 16, charmed the gathering with his inspiring spirituality and his easy humor.

This year's conference had a distinct Asian influence, with Bishop Jung inviting fellow Koreans and announcing an Ohio-Korea ministry partnership. He also honored Mary Fletcher Benton Scranton, a Cleveland Methodist who became the first female missionary to Korea in 1884, serving until her death in 1909.

The other big change was the announcement that Ohio's East and West UMC conferences would unite, with a target date of 2028 – which will give the two leadership teams time to consolidate various offices, programs and financial aspects.

Ohio's two UMC conferences are divided east and west by a line from the Ohio River to Lake Erie. In the wake of the disaffiliation two years ago by 248 East Ohio churches and a large number of West Ohio churches, church leadership believes it will be more efficient and cost effective to unite into one.

Other than that acknowledgment of our painful split, however, the spirit of the conference was to look forward, not back, with the usual celebration of newly ordained pastors and deacons, new assignments for a number of clergy, and updates from the various conference committees.

As usual, the conference honored retiring clergy, including former Mayfield Pastor Rev. Jim Winkler, recently of Painesville UMC. He quickly stepped into a new role as interim pastor at Hope Ridge UMC, Pastor Beth's former church.

Other familiar names were Rev. Edgar Brady, our former District Supervisor, who will be the new pastor in Painesville, and Bishop Jonathan D. Keaton, who preached a stirring sermon at the Saturday morning worship service. Bishop Keaton, who served as East Ohio Conference bishop from 1996 to 2004, received an especially warm welcome from the gathering.

Mayfield Church was well represented at the conference. Our praise band led Friday worship, with Worship Director Sarah Dixon staying on to lead the singing in the Saturday morning service. Pastor Beth led the group and successfully proposed funding support for youth camps. Also attending were Interim Associate Pastor Diane Bell and lay delegates Denny Nelson and Ted Diadiun.

Next year's conference is scheduled for June 11-13, again at the College of Wooster.
